
The Geography Curriculum

INTENT

Geography is a wide and varied subject that has something that will appeal to every student. Every child at Brixham College should have the chance to learn about the world around them and be able to consider their current and future role in it. The Geography curriculum lets students learn about people, places, patterns and processes. They will develop a deeper understanding of places from a global to local scale and appreciate the need to live in balance with a fragile environment. They will also learn and develop a wide range of skills including numeracy, literacy, communication, and fieldwork. Activities inside and beyond the classroom allow students to analyse data they collect and present findings using a range of mathematical and graphical skills. Opportunities to write at length are included in the curriculum for each year group.

IMPLEMENTATION

With mastery underpinning teaching and learning, an enquiring and questioning approach to geographical issues is developed in all learners. Students are asked to consider the big issues of our time and question the relevance of what they do in class. Students are given opportunities to use their geographical skills and research to discover the answers. Students' descriptive skills are developed and with increasing knowledge and understanding, their ability to explain, evaluate and assess are established and improve as they move up through the key stages. Extra-curricular activities, visits and field trips broaden horizons and help to bring the classroom theory alive and provide further relevance and context.



Geography contributes to the learning by:

- Providing opportunities for all pupils to learn and achieve with a focus on developing pupils' core geographical knowledge.
- Promoting pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural (SMSC) development and prepares pupils for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of life.
- · Providing pupils with the opportunity to explore local, national and international issues, including current affairs.
- Providing literacy and numeracy opportunities.
- · Enabling pupils to recognise their role in contributing to improving local and global environments.

CASE STUDIES

Meet: Molly Wallis (Yr 13 Student - 2018-2019)
